Concession Operated Forest Service Day Use Sites with Fees

Sites that accept Northwest Forest Pass but not Golden Age, Access or other Day-use Passes.

- ◆ Gone Creek (Timothy Lk.)
- ◆ Hoodview (Timothy Lk)
- ◆ Oak Fork (Timothy Lk.)
- ◆ PGE- West Dam (Timothy Lk.)
- ◆ Pine Point Campground/Day Use (Timothy Lake)
- ◆ Lake Harriet Fish Creek
- ◆ Big Eddy Frog Lake
- ◆ Carter Bridge Rock Creek Reservoir
- ◆ Clear Lake Trillium Lake

Fee Stations at each of these sites

Buses and large vans pay additional fees.

Sites that don't accept Northwest Forest Pass or other passes and charge Day Use fees.

- ◆ Lost Lake
- ◆ Bagby Hot Springs - \$5 per person soaking fee
No parking fee at trailhead.

What kind of pass do I need and where do I get one?

Buy your pass before driving out to the trailhead. Northwest Forest Passes are \$5 per day or \$30 for a 12 month pass. Forest Service offices and over 20 private vendors sell passes in the Mt.
